Shinichi Aizawa is a sociologist of education whose research explores the mechanisms of social stratification and reproduction through education in modern and contemporary Japan. Combining quantitative and historical-comparative approaches, his work addresses topics such as educational expansion, the role of private schools, poverty, and cultural capital. He currently holds a tenured professorship at Sophia University and is a visiting researcher at the Free University of Berlin (2025–2026). Previously, he held an associate professorship at Chukyo University and was also a visiting researcher at the Free University of Berlin in 2016–2017.
